The **Poznan 1956 protests**, also known as **Poznan 1956 uprising** or **Poznan June** (in Polish: *Poznański Czerwiec*), were the first of several massive protests of the Polish people against the communist dictatorial government of the People's Republic of Poland. Demonstrations by workers demanding better conditions began on June 28, 1956, at Poznan's Cegielski Factories and were met with violent repression. **Poznan June** had an effect on the **Hungarian Revolution of 1956**. June 28, the anniversary of those events was established holiday - National Memorial Day of the Poznan June 1956. The photo shows the entrance to the Museum Poznan June 1956.



Regulations



- 1. Goals:** celebrate the 68th anniversary of the **Poznan June 1956**, especially in memory of **Maj. Jerzy Grabus**, activation of the practice of amateur radio operators, improvement of operator's skills, mainly among teenagers interested in the practice of the amateur radio operation.
- 2. Organizer:** The General Kazimierz Raszewski School Radio Amateur Club **SP3PGR** (e-mail: sp3pgr@wp.pl) operating among students of Poznan primary schools (SP18 and SP46) in cooperation with the Marshal Józef Piłsudski Reserve Officers' Association (biuro@zorrpwlkp.pl), as well as in cooperation with the Hungarian radio amateurs. The honorary patronage of the contest is provided by the president of veterans' association. The Manager of contest is Jacek Behrendt SP3JB sq3opm@wp.pl.
- 3. Participants:** licensed national stations, individual and club foreign stations as well as short wave listeners (SWL), with the application of one transmitter with limitation of power fed to the antenna to 100 W. All of the participants must provide their call in the manner compliant with these *Regulations* as well as submit to the Organizer their log for classification in due time. Failure to fulfil the aforementioned conditions shall result in disqualification.
- 4. Period of time:** **June 22, 2024 16:00-17:59 UTC**. The participants provide "CQ Contest" (SSB – Wywołanie w Zawodach Poznańskich) or "test SP" (CW).

5. Bands and modes: 3,5 MHz, 7 MHz PHONE and CW mode, in compliance with bidding IARU R1 Band Plan HF. The cross-band type of connection is not taken into consideration.

6. Classification groups:

A – Poznan stations, district of Poznan stations /**POZNAN**/

B – Hungarian stations /**HUNGARY**/

C – other stations SSB+CW /**MIXED**/

D – other stations SSB /**PHONE**/

E – other stations, only **CW**

F – listening stations /**SWL**/

The participants, who conduct less than 5 QSO will not be classified in the given classification group and their logs as well as the organizer station **SP3PGR** will be used for control only /**CHECKLOG**/. The Participant may be classified only in one group.

7. Reports:

- station **SP3PGR** and special stations having the number **68** or **1956** in their call give RS(T) + letter **O**,
for example **59(9) O**,
- stations from Poznan and from the district of Poznan give RS(T) + letter **P**, for example **59(9) P**,
- stations from the Budapest agglomeration (HA5, HG5) and members BRASZ stations give RS(T) + letter **B**,
for example **59(9) B**,
- other stations including stations operating outside of Poland give only RS(T) + number QSO,
for example **59(9) 01**.

The faultless QSO is considered to be the connection, in which both stations correctly enumerate their call, report and control group as well as the band by logging with this information with the discrepancy of UTC time not bigger than 3 minutes (it also applies to the logs SWLs).

8. Points:

- QSO/HRD with the organizer station giving letter **O** in the control group – 10 points
- QSO/HRD with the station giving letter **P** or **B** in the control group – 5 points
- QSO/HRD with other foreign station – 3 points
- QSO/HRD with other national station – 1 point

9. Multipliers: for each station giving letter **O**, **P** or **B** in the control group multiplier with a value of **1** will be granted once on each band separately by the Organizer. Each participant starts contest with a multiplier of values **1**.

10. Final result: the sum of points for QSO x the sum of obtained multipliers separately for each band. In the case of SWLs, points and multipliers are granted for both stations specified in the log.

11. Awards: for the occupation of the first places in each group - a cup and a diploma, for the occupation of the places from the second to the third - a diploma. Other participants will receive certificate of participation in the contest in electronic form (PDF format). It is possible to award a cup or engraving donated by one of the living members of the immediate family of **Major Jerzy Grabus** outside the regulations.

12. Log in electronic form in *cabrillo* format to the following address: sp3pgr@wp.pl or biuro@zorrpwlkp.pl. The deadline for sending of logs expires on **June 23, 2024**.

13. Announcement of the results will be available to the public by the end of June on the organizer's website <https://zorrpwlkp.pl/konkursy.htm> and on the LogSP portal website <https://logsp.pzk.org.pl/?page=contest&id=1979>.

14. The decisions of the **Contest Committee** under direction of Jacek Behrendt SP3JB are final and aren't subject to any complaint.
